





GOD IS BUILDING HIS CHURCH



God spoke to Stuart when he was driving home after being part of Centre Street Church's Encounter God weekend. The message was clear and simple, "It's time."

"So I did it," Stuart says, "I just said, 'Lord, I give my life to you.' It was an instant change; it wasn't a week or two later, it was right then and there when I felt the difference."

difference. The community around the Centre for the City's Monday night evangelism outreach was the first place Stuart made connection with CSC. Each Monday

night, teams of people from CSC go out into the community looking to have good conversations and share the love of God with the people they encounter. For Stuart, the next step was an Encounter God discipleship weekend, which allows people to enter into healing and freedom in Christ. First, Stuart made a connection with people, and this lead to a connection with Jesus.

Each of these ministries is made possible by people and communities on mission, pursuing God and encouraging others to do the same. We pursue God through conversations and programs, in large worship services and in small prayer gatherings. We pursue God in personal prayer and reading of scripture and in gathering together for days of prayer and times of teaching.

Stuart took the step of baptism and now shares his story with other people and prays for them. He is a demonstration of what it means to pursue God.

HAILEY'S SXO

A simple, genuine invitation is sometimes all it takes to make a big difference in someone's life.

Hailey was someone who was nervous about relationships. "I think I felt like I wasn't worthy enough," she says, "and I wouldn't be able to maintain relationships because my mindset was that I don't want to be the first to get left behind."

behind." A simple invitation from a friend – someone Hailey reconnected with during a CSC family camp- meant that Hailey

attended a youth event where she saw Lydia who provided an invitation of her own, asking Hailey if she would be interested in a student leadership program called Legacy. At Legacy, Hailey encountered a community of young people who cared about her and were committed to the church.

The Kingdom of God advances through healthy and caring relationships. Hailey experienced this through Legacy, but relationships happen everywhere – in small groups, through teams that serve together in the community and at the church, in hospitality extended between friends and with strangers. The important thing is that our relationships point us and others to Christ.

CSC pursues relationships by providing one-on-one discipleship, where two people can explore their relationship with Jesus together, or Alpha, where conversations about life and faith happen in a context of hospitality. The invitation to relationship is available to everyone who is willing to accept it.

"My mission is my community" says Andrea. "I get to work with people from all over Calgary, coming from different backgrounds. Becoming friends with the people I work with, including my neighbours and my community, is the first step to getting to share my life and where my hope lies." Andrea and her husband Paul are a family working together to invite people into relationship, and ultimately to Jesus.

"Every day we have an opportunity to not just share the gospel, but be the gospel,"

says CSC supported global worker Renee. Renee thinks of South Campus as her church home, even as she pursues mission in the African nation of Ghana. "We need to be intentional in praying for God to open our eyes to see opportunities." Opportunities like those Katie and Cam see at their local playground, where they've connected with the parents of their children's friends, offering hospitality, conversation and even childcare in Jesus' name.

Centre Street Church pursues mission through Missional Communities, and through youth and young adult trips that reach out to Indigenous communities in Saskatchewan and youth here in Calgary.

"We want to follow God, we want to follow where He leads us," says Paul. "Sometimes it's overseas, and sometimes it's right in your own backyard. Sometimes it's to that neighbour who just needs to know that you care."

"Jesus spent a lot of time around tables," says Steve Griffin, pastor of Centre for the City. "He wanted to look at them eyeto-eye and let them know that they are loved. That is the focus of our café space."

The café space is a place where people in need from the community can come together to socialize, have a good meal and access additional support. This welcoming space has been made possible through God's goodness

expressed in the generosity of our congregation.

Centre Street Church has been generous with these spaces – inviting the community to join us for coffee at our Bearspaw campus, for pickleball in our new gym or for English language instruction in one of our new classrooms.

Working as a hair stylist, Danae is in a profession that allows her to have time with people and to look after them, helping them, building a connection with them. It also means that she has time to talk to them and listen to them.

A few years ago, Danae began to build a friendship with a regular client. They chatted, talking about a range of topics; about their lives, about the need for community, about what they believed. Danae realized that this was

someone who not only needed Jesus (we all need Jesus) but also might be open to the possibility of a relationship with Him. When she shared the gospel, Danae worried that she hadn't done a good job, but she kept including invitations to church during appointments.

Eventually her client said that she and her husband were looking for a deeper level of community, and Danae again invited them to church. This time they accepted the invitation and over the next two years both she and her husband also accepted Jesus. Danae just naturally talked about the importance of Jesus and offered an invitation. A life was changed not because someone travelled across an ocean, or spent a lot of money, but only because a friend talked to her while doing her hair.
